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## EXCHANGES, PAST & FUTURE INBOUNDS

### September 2013

Unfortunately Araraquara Brazil could not secure sufficient members to participate in the planned exchange to Dubuque and West Michigan and cancelled.

Rather than let this summer slip by without an inbound your board decided to experiment with a themed exchange discussed previously by offering it as a domestic exchange this year.

This was discussed with FFI in Atlanta and they agreed to assist with promoting it for us. A budget was developed and a description submitted and this has gone out to all FFI members signed up to receive the World of Friends catalog in the US. We will accept 20 ambassadors. The budget includes FFI fees, rental of canoes, trail fee and bicycles (and shuttling of same), Fenn Valley tour, dune buggy tour, two naturalists for a day, a 2 hour sail on the ship Friends Good Will, museum entries (Maritime and Ford Presidential), 1 lunch out, farewell and welcome dinners as well as a burger and beer at HopCat for the ambassadors.

If sufficient response is not received prior to June 17 we will discuss with Atlanta about promoting it internationally.



**Summer of 2014** - Plans will continue to be pursued for a similar themed exchange but for the international community as an inbound for 2014. In addition we would plan to have a lecture by a WMU professor who's expertise on Lake Michigan would be utilized. We would also incorporate any suggestions provided by guests from this year's trial exchange.

### **OUTBOUNDS**

#### **June 27 - July 15 2013 to Norderstedt and Braunschweig-Peine, Germany.**

Nine members from FF of W. Michigan are looking forward to this exchange. In addition there are members from Lansing, NE Ohio, Huntsville, Alabama, Northern Illinois, Cincinnati and Big Canoe, GA joining the group.

We will keep you informed, so that if this exchange does not appear that it will proceed you will have time to select another destination from the World of Friends Catalog for travel in 2014.
