As our 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary year comes to a close I want to take a few minutes to consider where we have been and where we are going. Our membership presently stands at 53, with the possibility of several more members being added in the months just ahead. That is up from 28 members in 2010. The increase in new members is even more dramatic than it first appears because 10 of those members from 2010 are no longer in the club. That means that we have gained 35 new club members during the past five years, a time when many other Friendship Force clubs have been in decline. And, as we grow larger, we also grow younger and that too bodes well for the future.

This year we hosted two successful inbound exchanges for the first time, a domestic exchange with Louisville, Kentucky and an international exchange with the Bruanschweig-Peine Club of Germany. Though we were not granted an outbound exchange by Atlanta for 2015, 15 of our members logged 16 weeks of outbound travel during the year with other Friendship Force clubs, visiting Haliburton and Ottawa, Ontario; Central Europe; Columbia; Cuba; North Carolina; Peru; and Russia. In addition, six of our members traveled together to Hawaii for three weeks, where they met with members of the Kauai Club and renewed friendships formed when two of that club's members participated in our Fourth Coast Adventures exchange in 2014. Next year our club is scheduled to travel outbound twice, to Omaha, Nebraska and Australia, and to have at least one international inbound exchange, with Aichi, Japan.

As our club has grown we have sought to open up more opportunities, particularly for our newer members, to grow into leadership roles by doubling the size of our elected Board of Directors from four to eight persons. This change has spurred our Board to carry out an extensive revision of the by-laws, something that all of you will receive in the next few days to consider before our annual meeting in December. Please take the time to familiarize yourself with the key changes being proposed so that you can vote intelligently at the annual meeting.

Finally, the Board is considering raising club dues from \$25 per person to \$35. Club dues were raised last year from \$20 to \$25, but that was in response to an increase in the per capita amount sent to Atlanta. The portion of your dues retained by the club remained at \$10. The membership increases mentioned above have required more marketing on our part and that has driven up club expenses to the point where we feel that more revenue is needed to support those marketing activities as well as the greater role in hosting exchanges. To date, most of you appear to favor an increase in dues rather than the development of fund raising events. As soon as the Board hears from a majority of the membership on this point, we will make a decision on the question of revenue enhancement.

Finally, I want to thank all of you once again for the wonderful support you provided for our recently completed inbound exchange. Almost 75% of our membership was involved in some way in making that exchange a success. That is something to be proud of.

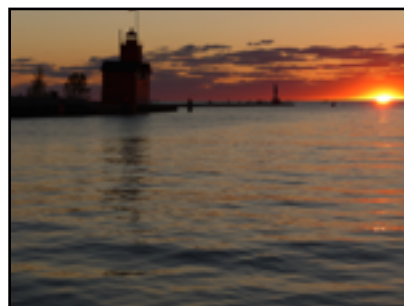

## “I’M IN” Campaign:

As a newly elected board member, Lyn Hargreave has been on the “inside” with what is happening to our organization and would like to share the following with you.

Enrichment Voyages which our organization has offered these past several years has brought in ~\$100,000 in revenue. But the university who sponsored these trips has ceased this activity. Thus we (FFI) loses that revenue stream. As our membership ages we are finding that many of our older clubs are finding it difficult to recruit new members and therefore exchanges are going out undersubscribed causing another loss in revenue. Loss of membership means downsizing the home-stay, the core of our organization. What to do?

Charter members of FF of W. MI found out about the international organization when they read an article in a “Family Circle” magazine in about 1988. That kind of an advertising campaign has not happened for a long time. It costs money. But before the board can even consider an advertising campaign they must first update their website. Though our local club has been doing well, and growing we are the exception. .

If you have been getting email messages from FFI in Atlanta you are aware that the organization is asking for \$40,000 for the new website. There are many limitations with the present site and before more information can be added, it is necessary to update. They are not filling staff positions, and are making other money saving decisions but still find it necessary to turn to the organization’s membership for help.

Your local board has not taken any action to do this as a club. We would prefer to let this up to our members to consider the future of the organization and contribute to this campaign.
