More news from Nancy Draayer, with Lisa Fisher, about their trip to Turkey in October:

The highlight of Turkey was Cappadocia with it's awe-inspiring balloon ride over a magical terrain of 'fairy chimneys'. We arose at 4:30 a.m. to board the basket of the hot air balloon and it was well worth it. We floated over and among the mountains as the sun rose. See the photo, as words just don't do it justice.

Other places of interest were the Goreme open-air museum which includes a network of caves that were turned into monasteries and Byzantine churches dating as far back as the 5th century. Also, of interest are the underground cities built for people to hide from their enemies during various conflicts over the centuries. Imagine living in these subterranean cities for months. If hiking is an interest, I recommend the Red and Rose Valleys where you see cave dwellings and tent rock formations as well as beautiful vistas.

Also, in the Cappadocia area are the Turkish baths. Check your modesty at the

door and enjoy getting scrubbed in a public bath (genders separated). I also enjoyed a gentle massage afterward. Then head to watch the whirling dervishes. If you imagined the whirling dervish to be a colorful and flashy form of entertainment as I did, it couldn't be farther from the truth. The traditional dervish was dressed in white performing a spiritual whirling dance to meditative music. It's fascinating, but if you've already had a long day you may enjoy some caffeine before the performance. The show is very relaxing and hypnotic. I could have spent a week in the Cappadocia area alone.

Turkey has a long and rich history dating back to the beginning of civilization and there are many archaeological ruins to prove it. Ephesus, being one of the most famous, is a must see. As I walked through the ruins of this ancient city, I imagined the theater/stadium where the gladiators fought, the grand library filled with books and the marble street filled with people going to the market. Don't be surprised if you sit down on a park bench or somewhere around the many ruins, that suddenly you have a cat sitting on your lap. Cats are honored by Muslims and it is said that is why they always land on their feet. In summary, if you're interested in beautiful scenery, amazing ancient ruins, historic locations and maybe even a Turkish bath, Turkey is a must do trip.
