Great Cycle Trails of New Zealand

Lisa Fisher and I recently did this Global FF Journey with 16 other ecyclists from the USA and Canada. The group cycled on trails in Auckland, Hamilton, Cambridge, Waikato, Kapiti, Hutt Valley and Central Otago. We were lucky enough to have perfect weather throughout the entire three weeks, and the scenery was spectacular. As well as 10 days of biking, the group travelled from Auckland to Queenstown by bus, ferry and train. Along the way, we were treated to a Maori cultural experience at Kohutapu Lodge, visited glowworm caves at Waitomo, enjoyed hospitality from the Hamilton-Waikato, Kapiti Coast and Wellington clubs, visited a working ranch and admired the lakes, mountains, and farmland in both the North and

South Islands.

After arriving in Queenstown, fourteen of the original 18 stayed for another week to explore the Milford Sound region. We embarked on a ferry ride on Milford, Where we were treated to some of the most beautiful scenery I've ever encountered. We even saw dolphins swimming by the ship and seals playing on the rocks. Another highlight was hiking part of the Routeburn trail. The steep climb was well worth the stunning vistas at the top where we ate our lunch before heading back down. I personally enjoy seeing the NZ Wood pigeon, NZ fantail and many other endemic birds. It was a successful journey in which many friendships were formed while enjoying a shared interest. When the Unexpected Happens

In February I had the good fortune to go on a Friendship Force club trip to New Zealand. The trip (see above related article) was a 21 day excursion that included 10 days of biking on E bikes and staying with host families. Since New Zealand was at the top of our bucket list of places to visit, my partner, Larry Ellison, and I jumped on the opportunity. We landed in Auckland on February 8th. We had a wonderful welcome dinner on Saturday February 10th where we had the chance to meet all of our fellow travelers from clubs all over the United States and Canada. Sunday, Feb 11th we started with the first day of biking. We took the early ferry over to Waheke Island. We were fitted with E bikes and state of the art helmets. We had a lovely bike ride around the perimeter of the island culminating with a visit to a winery that sat on the top of a very big hill. If you've never been to New Zealand, the flat spots are few and far between. At the winery we enjoyed a 360° view. We were able to see downtown Auckland from across the bay. It was spectacular! Larry and I then decided to go back to a beach we had visited to just rest and relax for a little bit as the winery was the last stop on the tour for the day.

We started to head down the big hill and I looked down at my speedometer and realized I was going way too fast. As I applied the brakes, I looked up and saw Larry's front wheel violently oscillating. He lost control of the bike and had a horrific fall onto the road. He tumbled a good way and then came to a silent stop. Some bystanders called an ambulance.

The ambulance crew on the island took wonderful care of him and then they sent a police boat to get us with another ambulance crew in attendance. We crossed the harbor and we were transported to Auckland City Hospital by another ambulance.

I was so impressed with the care that he received at the hospital. New Zealand has national healthcare. All of the various medical specialties

worked together to make sure that he was thoroughly evaluated and an appropriate plan of care was developed for him. He ended up having multiple rib fractures, a fractured collarbone, a fractured shoulder blade, a bruised lung and a bruised kidney. He stayed in the hospital for 9 days!

I'm sure the thought going through your mind at this point is "I sure hope they had good travel insurance". We did, but so far they have not asked for the information!! The Accident Compensation Corporation is a fund established to care for anyone in the country of New Zealand who is involved in an accident or has a workplace injury. This extends to people from other countries who are on holiday in New Zealand. Net result after nine days in the hospital, three CT scans, multiple x-rays, a pain pump, and nerve blocks, our hospital bill so far is zero dollars!

I can't say enough good things about the people in New Zealand. We met a lovely couple on the ward in the hospital who invited us to their beach house after Larry got discharged from the hospital and we were able to have him rest and recover for four days there. He was then well enough to sit in the car so I rented a car and we toured many different places and salvaged the remainder of our vacation.

The friendship force ambassadors were very kind and compassionate, offering their thoughts and prayers for Larry. The person that handled making all the arrangements is working hard to get us as much refund as possible for the parts of the trip that we did not get to enjoy. We will also file a claim with our travel insurance.

So if you get the opportunity to go to New Zealand, please do, as it is spectacularly gorgeous. The people are kind and compassionate. And if you have a health event in New Zealand, you will be well taken care of.


